What is Group Triple P? Stepping Stones

Group Triple P Stepping Stones is a parenting programme which gives lots of different ideas to manage misbehaviour.

The Programme is for parents/ carers of children who have any additional needs or disabilities

The 7 Core Principles

1. Providing a safe interesting environment
2. Creating a positive learning environment
3. Using assertive discipline
4. Adapting to having a child with a disability
5. Being part of a community
6. Taking care of yourself as a parent
7. Having realistic expectations

Key Objects:

- Increase parents' skills in promoting good social, emotional & behaviour in their children
- Reducing parents use of ineffective methods of behaviour management
- Improving parent/Child communication
- Reducing parental stress linked with Parenting children

The Strategies of Group Triple P Stepping Stones

Promoting a Positive Relationship

Spending quality time, Communicating with children & Showing affection

Encouraging Desirable Behaviour

Descriptive praise, Positive Attention, Providing other rewards, Engaging activities & Setting up activity schedules

Teaching New Skills & Behaviours

Setting a good example, Using physical guidance, Incidental teaching, As-say-do, Teaching backwards, Behaviour charts, Behaviour charts

Managing Misbehaviour

Using diversion to another activity, Ground rules, Directed discussion, Planned ignoring, Clear calm instructions, Teaching children to communicate/logical consequences, Blocking, Brief interruption, Quiet time & Time out
