Absence and Illness

Please remember that a child's absence from school must be reported before 9:30am on each day of absence, for safeguarding purposes.

Please either ring school and leave a message on our dedicated absence line or register the absence on the school website.

Attendance and absence are monitored closely. If a child's attendance falls below 90% in any one term, this is reported, and we will write to you. Non-attendance has a negative impact on progress and attainment for any child.

Any child that is sick should be given 48 hours before returning to school—to avoid spreading any illness.

No Nut Policy

Please remember, we operate a strict 'No Nut Policy' in school. We do have children with severe allergies. We appreciate your support in checking the ingredients when making up your child's healthy lunchboxes and snacks.

Medical Conditions

If your child has a medical condition it is imperative that you notify school and advise us of any treatment that may be required. A healthcare plan can be written up, then monitored and updated accordingly.

<u>Please keep us informed of any changes.</u>

If you are concerned about a child, our Designated Safe Guarding Leads are Mr Westley and Mrs Russell. Please do share ANY concerns with them directly.

Smoking

Can we politely request that, in the interests of all our children, all parents and carers refrain from smoking during pick-up/ drop off at school. Thank you.

Food Bank

Our school is a voucher holder for the Deeping's Food Bank and can allocate vouchers to parents who may need this support. Please do speak to the office for details.

SPORT is BACK! After a few disrupted years due to covid and restrictions I am very pleased to announce that sport is back in full at DSJ. After the retirement of Mrs Duffy, I have taken on the role of PE Subject Lead along with mathematics.

Throughout this year our focus as a school is going to be on competitive and inclusive sports alongside mental health and well-being for all. It is a known fact that forms of physical exercise are not just beneficial for our physical health but also our mental health. Through the medium of sport, we are aiming to support children through challenges that they may face and develop their resilience to deal with situations when things do not go as planned. We are also aiming to work towards the School Game Mark which

is and award that recognises how well schools ensure pupils are healthy, happy, active.



As a school we want to foster a 'When the going gets tough, the tough get going!' attitude which will then feed into all learning at DSJ supporting our ethos of 'Inspire to learn, Achieve together.'



We have made an excellent start to the year with the following achievements already:

We have re-introduced the Daily Mile for all KS2 children daily, KS1 children at least 3 times a week and EYFS once a week.

We continue to do activate and activate times tables after assembly which is another form of physical exercise which helps us all to have healthy minds that are ready to learn.

18 children in Y5/6 working through the 'Playground Leaders' course – meaning that they will be qualified to run fun, inclusive sports games during lunchtimes. Congratulations to all of you who completed the course.

4 Bronze Young Ambassadors selected from Y6 – George Willis, Harry Jibb, Hannah Cradock & Annabel Shepherd. These pupils have attended a training session and will support me, as PE subject lead, to promote all aspects of sport in our school for all this year. They are all excited to take on this prestigious role and have many ideas on promoting sport for all by being excellent sporting role models this year.

14 children from KS2 competed at the Barnack Schools Challenge 2.5K run on Saturday 8th October. It was a

warm, sunny day and team DSJ were awesome, especially as they were running up inclines that we are not used to in Deeping! 
