Vaccinations for 5-11 year-olds are available; for information around local 'pop-up clinics' in the area, please visit [www.lincolnshireccg.nhs.uk/grabajab](http://www.lincolnshireccg.nhs.uk/grabajab) or appointment can be booked on the national booking system or by calling 119.

**12-15 year-olds**  
The contract for the Covid-19 Vaccination Team visiting schools ended on 31st March 2022. The high numbers of covid cases in schools at the times the Vaccination Team visited numerous schools has resulted in many children not having had their covid vaccinations' first and second doses.

Whilst these appointments can still be booked at a time and location to suit through the national booking system or by calling 119, the Mass Vaccination Centre at Princess Royal Sports Arena in Boston is running walk-in sessions after school, over the weekends and during school holidays.

# DEFIBRILLATOR

**When to use a Defib**  
If someone is unresponsive and not breathing normally  
Note: You **DO NOT** NEED training to use this Defibrillator

**Is the person responsive?**  
How to check for a response – shake person's shoulders & ask loudly "are you OK?"

**Is the person breathing normally?**  
How to check if they are breathing: put your ear close to the person's nose and mouth, can you feel or hear them breathing normally?

**What to do if someone is not responsive or breathing**

- Call 999, ask for an ambulance and inform the operator that the patient is unresponsive and not breathing. Shout for help from anyone nearby
- Start CPR! 30 Chest Compressions and 2 breaths or compressions only
- Send someone to get the Defibrillator and continue CPR. Switch the Defib on and follow the instructions given by the Defib. This will require you to remove or cut the person's clothing and place pads on bare dry chest
- Continue CPR on instruction of Defib until professional help arrives or if the person regains consciousness

## Reminders...

### Absence and Illness

Please remember that a child's absence from school must be reported before 9:30am on each day of absence, for safeguarding purposes.

Please either ring school and leave a message on our dedicated absence line or register the absence on the school website.

Attendance and absence are **monitored closely**. If a child's attendance falls below 90% in any one term, this is reported, and we will write to you. Non-attendance has a negative impact on progress and attainment for any child.

Any child that is sick should be given 48 hours before returning to school—to avoid spreading any illness.

### No Nut Policy

Please remember, we **operate a strict 'No Nut Policy' in school**. We do have children with severe allergies. We appreciate your support in checking the ingredients when making up your **child's healthy lunchboxes and snacks**.

### Medical Conditions

If your child has a medical condition it is imperative that you notify school and advise us of any treatment that may be required. A healthcare plan can be written up, then monitored and updated accordingly.

Please keep us informed of any changes.
