The PTA are raising money to buy tools for the area and equipment so we can introduce fire making and cooking in the future.

The Forest School has been up and running with Year 3 in their curriculum time. During this term they have been able to make whittled gnomes, clay creatures, create blindfold trails, obstacle courses, make potions in the mud kitchen, bug hotels, shelter from the rain under shelters they made, carry casualties on stretchers they made, balance on slack lines and relax in hammocks to name but a few activities!

They have been able to make the most of the opportunities that the area offers too with the support of Mrs Magness, Mrs Merrimen and Mrs Prentice who have kindly given their time to support the pupils with me.

The children have learnt to work in teams, solve challenges and learn more about the Forest Environment . The children have all shown resilience in the cold, wet and muddy conditions. There have been so many smiles and not a single moan!

Any child that is sick should be given 48 hours before returning to school—to avoid spreading any illness.

Please remember, we operate a strict 'No Nut Policy' in school. We do have children with severe allergies. We appreciate your support in checking the ingredients when making up your child's healthy lunchboxes and snacks.

Medical Conditions

If your child has a medical condition it is imperative that you notify school and advise us of any treatment that may be required. A healthcare plan can be written up, then monitored and updated accordingly.

TOP TIPS TO ENCOURAGE READING FOR PLEASURE AT HOME

Model being a reader to your children, do your children see you read?

Remember reading doesn't have to be a novel, it can be newspapers, magazines, recipes, instruction, anything with words! Encourage children to read everywhere, involve them in reading the recipe for dinner, shopping lists in the supermarket even the TV listings when choosing what to watch, shared reading times don't have to be snuggled up with a book - however lovely that is. Use your voice to help bring books to life.
