How can parents help?

- Parents must model the value of education including the importance of regular education and good attendance.
- Arrange family trips, activities and holidays during the school holidays so that children miss as little school as possible.
- Schedule doctor and dental appointments in hours either prior to school or after school. If an appointment in school hours cannot be avoided, ensure your child is in school for as much of the day as possible.
- Establish good routines at home, including good sleep patterns.
- Make sure your child understands that you do not approve of missing school.
- Contact the school if attendance is becoming a problem—we can work together to improve things.
- Take an interest in your child's school work and be actively involved in school, Parents Evenings and events.

Statistics

One day of missed school is equal to as many as 3 days of catch up for a child to learn all the missed knowledge and skills.

Persistent non-attenders (attendance score lower than 90%) on average score 15-20% lower on assessments than pupils who attend school more regularly.

The earlier a pupil begins to have attendance problems the greater the impact on achievement!



Lessons start at 8:50am. Poor punctuality at school has a negative impact on learning.

5 minutes late each day = more than 3 days of school missed.

10 minutes late each day = almost 7 days of school missed.

Attendance at Deeping St. James Community Primary School

Attendance is a priority in our school and is closely monitored. Good attendance and punctuality is essential for good academic achievement, good social development and good mental health. It ensures children are safe and supported.

Attendance

EXCELLENT	Your child's attendance is 100% As well as being an excellent attender your child will almost certainly achieve the best outcomes for their ability and in later lifer. They will have real opportunity in further education or the world of work.	
GOOD	Your child's attendance is 98% - 99% Your child's attendance is good and they are likely to achieve their targets. This will give them the skills they need for the next phase of their education.	
EXPECTED	Your child's attendance is as expected at 97% and has reached the school's target which is set to ensure that learning is well supported. They have missed less than 6 days of school.	
NEEDS TO IMPROVE	Your child's attendance is 93% - 96%. They have missed over 8 days of school. Your child's attendance is in need of improvement. It is below the school target of 97%. Your child is missing learning and is in danger of falling behind .	
POOR and CAUSING SERIOUS CONCERN	Your child's attendance is 91%-92%. They have missed over 15 days (3 weeks) of school. Your child's attendance is poor and causing concern. They are in danger of becoming persistently absent and are missing a significant amount of learning. You would have received a letter and asked to meet with us in school to support your child's attendan and missed learning. Your child is missing so much time from school that it will be difficult for them to keep in touch with lessons and learning.	
VERY POOR and CAUSING SERIOUS CONCERN	Your child's attendance is 90% or below and regarded as persistently absent as they have missed over 17 days of school. Over 5 years this is the same as missing half a school year. This is very poor attendance and of great concern. There is a risk of Local Authority action eg. a Fixed Penalty Fine or further legal prosecution if your child's attendance does not improve. Your child is missing so much time from school that it will be exceptionally difficult for them to keep in touch with lessons and learning.	

There are 190 school days in a year.

Why is important to attend school every day?

- Research has proven that high levels of attendance improve academic performance.
- Pupils with the highest attainment at the end of Year 6 and in GCSEs have higher rates of attendance.
- At Year 6 pupils not meeting the expected standard in reading, writing and maths had overall absence rate of 4.7% compared to 3.5% among those meeting the expected standard.
- For GCSEs in English and maths those not achieving a grade over 4 had double the absence rate as those that achieved grade 9 to 4.
- Regular attendance encourages the development of social and emotional skills that are essential for life.
- Missing learning causes anxiety for absent children and missing playtimes inhibits the development of friendships.

We have had another wonderful term in Forest School. Year 4 have completed 6 sessions where they were challenged to build Dens for Goblins and then themselves. They worked cooperatively with their friends with fantastic results. Some of the children even went on to create an outdoor shower that they used ! There was a wonderful sense of community with this group as they developed a business in mud glue, a bakery (Mud Pies being the dish of the day) and trade in sticks. Their communication skills were fantastic, as was their creativity. The final day there was a lot of rain but this did not deter this group, in fact most saw it as an opportunity to enjoy the mud !

Year 6 also had a day in Forest School, they made Goblin Shelters for reception children to find. They took the reception children out to find Goblins creating stories as they went. The Year 6 stepped up to this responsibility and made it a fun adventure for them all. The Year 6 were then rewarded with a cake in their Dens to round off the session.

The children that took part in the 30 Days Wild in June were rewarded with a picnic and play in the Forest School area with me. They spent 30 Days enjoying things in the outdoors and were very enthusiastic about sharing what they had done, well done.

As you know I will be teaching Forest School three afternoons a week next year, I am in my final stages of my qualification and will complete the course over the summer. This means we can start full Forest School early in the new term. I will be able to include tools in the sessions and start to introduce the skills for fire making.

The PTA have used the money raised to provide a lot of kit for these sessions next year which includes, plates, cups, Kelly kettles, kettles, flints to start fires, bill hooks, saws, loppers, buckets, gloves, east iron cooking sets, hammers, knives, ropes, water drums, drills and much much more ! TOP TIPS TO ENCOURAGE READING FOR PLEASURE AT HOME

Model being a reader to your children, do your children see you read?

Remember reading doesn't have to be a novel, it can be newspapers, magazines, recipes, instruction, anything with words! Encourage children to read everywhere, involve them in reading the recipe for dinner, shopping lists in the supermarket even the TV listings when choosing what to watch, shared reading times don't have to be snuggled up with a book - however lovely that is. Use your voice to help bring books to life. You can work with your child to decide what voice characters should have and do the sound effects! It may feel a little silly to begin with, but your child will love to hear you involved in their story.


